
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### ▲ Portfolio Allocation

### ▲ Manager's Comment

In August, the Wind All-A Index fell by 2.86%, the CSI 300 Index fell by 2.19%, the MSCI China A50 Index fell by 1.99%, the ChiNext Index fell by 3.75%, the Hang Seng Index fell by 1%, and the Hang Seng Technology Index fell by 1.33%. The performance of the Chinese market in August was slightly better than that of US stocks, and the decline of Hong Kong stocks was also smaller than that of A shares in the same period. From the perspective of sector structure, among the A shares, energy, telecommunications services, finance, real estate, and daily consumption outperformed the market, while materials, discretionary consumption, industry, and information technology underperformed.

In August, A-shares showed an oscillating trend of first rising and then falling, while the Hong Kong stock index was relatively stable throughout the month. In terms of internal factors, the epidemic in key cities such as Shenzhen, Chengdu, and Dalian increased in August, and the escalation of prevention and control measures caused the market to worry about economic operation. Although China's manufacturing index rebounded month-on-month in August, it was still in the contraction range. The non-manufacturing PMI fell to 52.6% month-on-month but remained in the expansion range. From the perspective of government policy, the National Convention at the end of August continued to release a signal of steady growth. However, factors such as real estate and the epidemic still make investors worry about the downward pressure on the economy. In terms of external factors, the hawkish speech of the Chairman of the Federal Reserve has pushed up the US dollar index and US bond interest rates. Investors' concerns about geopolitics and economic recession have pushed up the US dollar index, which has also led to capital outflows from emerging markets. The renminbi began in mid-August Continued depreciation and capital outflows also weighed on emerging markets. At the end of August, China and the United States signed an audit and supervision cooperation agreement, but after the information was released, Chinese stocks opened higher and lower, and investors chose to wait and see the progress of the implementation of the agreement, which may be behind the continued tension between China and the United States. The overall performance of the market is weak and the defensive value segment outperformed growth.

Looking forward to the future, the core observation factors are still the degree of recovery of the Chinese economy, the degree of global economic downturn in the context of interest rate hikes by European and American central banks, and changes in Sino-US relations. We need to closely observe the impact of factors such as real estate and the epidemic on China's economic recovery. The Chinese market is still at an attractive valuation level. Given the uncertain economic growth and external environment, the market may be volatile. Investors' expectations are already pessimistic. We believe that A-shares will have more stock selection opportunities, and our strategy is still to allocate China's manufacturing and new energy sectors that are growing in the medium and long term.
