

▲ Investment Objective

The Fund seeks to achieve long term capital growth by primarily (i.e. not less than 70% of its Net Asset Value) investing in China-Related Technology Companies (as defined below). To achieve the investment objective, not less than 70% of the Fund's Net Asset Value will be invested in equities of technology companies which, in the opinion of the Manager, will likely benefit from innovations, use of new technologies or offering products and services that meet the demands of the new and evolving China coroner (China-Related Technology Companies') with registered offices located in the Greater China area (including Mainland China, Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan), and/or China Related Technology Companies that do not have their registered offices in the Greater China area but either (a) carry out a predominant proportion of their business activities in Greater China or (b) are holding companies which predominantly own companies with registered offices in Greater China.



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▲ Manager's Comment

The Hang Seng Technology Index rose 4.74% in November. Influenced by factors such as the better-than-expected US employment data, the FOMC's confirmation of a pause in interest rate hikes, and the US Treasury's debt refinancing plan falling short of expectations, the US dollar index and US bond yields significantly declined, positively impacting major global risk assets. While there were some advancements in US-China relations, they did not exceed market expectations. The leaders of the US and China held a 4-hour meeting in San Francisco, reaching many important consensuses. However, market reactions suggested limited impact on further boosting investor risk appetite. Despite ongoing improvements in external factors, the performance of the Chinese stock market in November lagged behind major overseas markets, particularly in sectors highly correlated with the macroeconomy such as finance, real estate, and consumption. Market expectations for Chinese economic growth were relatively pessimistic. On one hand, market expectations for growth, especially policy advancement, were influenced to some extent by concerns about the budget deficit before the Central Economic Work Conference. On the other hand, underperformance of some leading internet companies' performance led to an overall decline in the internet sector, significantly impacting market sentiment. The Chinese stock market experienced a decline in late November.

The fund performed better than the Hang Seng Technology Index in November. The fund achieved positive excess returns in stock selection within the communication services and information technology industries, as well as in industry allocation in industrial, discretionary consumer, materials, energy, and healthcare sectors. However, it recorded a slight negative excess return in stock selection and industry allocation within the staple consumer and financial sectors. The fund will continue to adhere to a prudent and sustainable investment philosophy, striving for better performance in the medium to long term through reasonable industry allocation and botom-up stock selection.

Looking ahead, the current valuation of the Chinese stock market is at a historical low, and the domestic economy is gradually recovering. The upcoming meetings of the Political Bureau and the Central Economic Work Conference are expected to provide clearer signals for the market's future trends. On November 20th, Premier Li Keqiang presided over a meeting of the Central Financial Committee, emphasizing the need to improve the quality of financial services for economic and social development. While maintaining the stability of monetary policy, there will be increased support for major strategic areas, key sectors, and weak links. In terms of US-China relations, on November 15th, the leaders of both countries held a meeting and agreed to promote and strengthen dialogues and cooperation in various fields. The sharp drop in US bond yields, combined with the rekindled market expectations of a Fed rate cut due to the PCE data released last week, has pushed the probability of the end of the Fed's tightening cycle in the CME futures market to over 99%. The probability of the first rate cut in March 2024 has risen to 42%. However, the recent divergence of the Chinese stock market from major overseas markets indicates that domestic factors are currently the main drivers of its performance. The situation of the Chinese economy's fundamentals, growth expectations, and the scale and pace of stimulus policies will be crucial in determining the future trend of the Chinese stock market. The fund will continue to adopt a relatively proactive investment strategy and grasp more opportunities at the individual stock level in a complex market environment.
